Dear David,

I am pleased to advise you that the Foreign Secretary has approved your application to become the ex-FCO Representative on the Governing Body of School of Oriental and Asian Studies (SOAS) subject to the following conditions:

- i) For two years from your last day of service (28 February 2014) you should not become personally involved in lobbying UK Government on behalf of your new employers; lobbying in this context means that the former civil servant should not engage in communication with Government (including Ministers, Special Advisers and officials) with a view to influencing a Government decision or policy in relation to their own interests, or the interests of the organisation by which they are employed, or to whom they are contracted. Please note that this does not preclude routine contact;
- ii) You should not draw on privileged information available to you as a Civil Servant

I would be grateful if you would inform the secretariat team at the Advisory Committee on Business Appointments (acoba@acoba.gsi.gov.uk) direct side copying me in as soon as you take up this appointment or, if earlier, when the appointment is announced (a form is enclosed for this purpose). This will enable ACOBA to deal with any enquires as it does not release information about appointments which have not been taken up or announced.

Once the appointment has been publicly announced or taken up, ACOBA will include the main details, together with the Advisory Committee's advice on it and the date on which it was taken up, in both the regularly updated consolidated list they put on their website at <http://acoba.independent.gov.uk> and in their next annual report.
