The general wording of the questions is woolly in many cases. It is unclear precisely who DSA wish to approach in such claims. In general, we support the proposals but retain scepticism over the extent of DSA enquiries and demands for proof which may manifest once this becomes law.

We fully support the protection of the public, in this case learner drivers. However, we are most deeply disturbed that we have one and possibly two ADI perverts working in this area. DSA state that unless a pupil makes a personal complaint, nothing can be done! I know of three girl pupils who have suffered physical assault by one instructor. Should DSA, rightly, seek powers as detailed in this consultation, then they also MUST take meaningful action to act on information provided. To state that ONLY the person assaulted can make a complaint is negligent in the extreme as I have learned that those assaulted believe that they will not be believed and, therefore, do not complain. This leads to the same instructor carrying on as he knows his pupils won't complain. Take action before some poor girl gets raped in an instructors car!

Generally the Consultation paper was informative and thorough.

My main criticisms would be:

1. The consultation consists of a series of closed questions (choose option A or option B).

This form of consultation severely limits the ability of respondent to put forward alternative or creative ideas that may not have been considered by the writers of the consultation paper and may be better than the two alternatives provided for consideration.

2. There is inbuilt bias in the consultation as the writers (who are in a position of power and authority) are clearly expressing their preference - SEE section 10.6 - where the writer states in BOLD "This would be our preference". This clearly influences the behaviour and responses of the respondents on a subliminal level if not overtly, and thus open free choice in response could be

challenged here.

**General Comments:** 

- 1) If an ADI is wrongly suspened from the register and later reinstated, the last thing the ADI needs is to be caught up in wrangling with the DSA over amounts of compensation.
- 2) To have varying levels of compensation, where third parties get involved, where trading accounts from the past might not be up to date, will inevitably lead to disputes, potential litigation delays and upset and could prove an administrative nightmare.
- 3) If an ADI is reinstated after wrongful suspension, the onus must be on the DSA to inform him of his rights to compensation and reasonable, fixed scales of compensation should be promptly paid out to the wronged party.
- 4) Non income related payments should reflect the time an ADI was on the register. Non income losses to a newly qualified ADI franchised to a driving school will be far less (but no easier to work out) than a well established ADI of many years standing who traded independently.
