Further breakdowns of proven reoffending of adult offenders in England and Wales released from custodial sentences of less than 12 months in 2012, by type of re-offence and month of re-offence

30 January 2015

## Background

This ad-hoc statistical notice presents further breakdowns of already published information on proven re-offending.

Table 1 in this statistical notice provides information on the number of adult offenders in England and Wales who were released from a short custodial (less than 12 months) in 2012 and went on to commit a proven re-offence, by type of re-offence and month of re-offence. A proven re-offence is defined as any offence committed in a 12 month follow-up period and resulting in a court conviction, caution, reprimand or warning in either the 12 month follow-up period or within a further six month waiting period (to allow time for the offence to be proven in court).
