Police Funding Consultation

- Consultation on the Reform of Police Funding Arrangements in England and Wales – 2015
- Central Government £7.8bn + Police Precept £3bn
- The drivers of crime / demands on the police: alcohol; drugs; character; opportunity; CJS; and, profit
- Proposed model: population; police precept; households with no working adult and dependent children; hard pressed population; and, bar density
- Weighting of model

Hard Pressed

- Low income, larger families, semis
- Low income, older people, small semis
- Low income, routine jobs, terraces and flats
- Low income families, terraced estates
- Families and single parents, many children
- Single elderly people, council flats
- Single parents and pensioners, council terraces
- Families and single parents, council flats
- Old people, many high rise estates,
- Multi-ethnic purpose built estates, multi-ethnic, crowded flats











Opportunities

- Challenges (demands, austerity) become drivers of Opportunity (causes and consequences) when placed in the context of Partnership and Evidence
