# ADMISSION APPEALS FOR MAINTAINED PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN ENGLAND 2008/09

#### INTRODUCTION

This annual Statistical First Release provides information about appeals lodged by parents during the academic year 2008/09 against non-admission of their children to their preferred school. It includes all appeals lodged during the academic year across all year groups. Information is provided on the number and percentage of appeals that have been lodged by parents; heard by an appeals panel and decided in favour of the parents.

See Technical Notes 6 and 7 for details of a change to the way admission numbers have been derived.

# **KEY POINTS (Tables 1 and 2)**

#### Infant classes

- In infant classes within primary schools, 23,810 appeals were lodged in 2008/09 compared with 18,550 in 2007/08.
- 16,410 appeals were heard by a panel in 2008/09 compared with 12,690 in the previous year; this represents 2.6 per cent of all new admissions to infant classes within maintained primary schools, compared with 2.1 per cent in the previous year.
- 2,590 appeals were decided in favour of the parents in 2008/09 compared with 2,060 in the previous year; this represents 15.8 per cent of appeals heard by a panel in 2008/09, compared with 16.2 per cent in the previous year.

# Primary schools (including infant classes)

- In 2008/09, 38,080 appeals were lodged for admission to maintained primary schools, compared to 32,600 in 2007/08.
- 25,890 appeals were heard by a panel in 2008/09 compared with 22,220 in the previous year. This represents 3.1 per cent of all new admissions to maintained primary schools in 2008/09, compared with 2.7 per cent in the previous year.
- 6,460 appeals were decided in favour of the parents in 2008/09 compared with 6,190 in the previous year; this represents 25.0 per cent of appeals heard by a panel in 2008/09, compared with 27.8 per cent in the previous year.

# Secondary schools

- In secondary schools, 50,200 appeals were lodged in 2008/09 compared with 53,430 in 2007/08.
- 37,830 appeals were heard by a panel in 2008/09 compared with 39,730 in the previous year. This represents 5.9 per cent of all new admissions, compared with 6.0 per cent in the previous year.
- 12,600 appeals were decided in favour of the parents in 2008/09 compared with 12,970 in the previous year; this represents 33.3 per cent of appeals heard by a panel, compared with 32.6 per cent in the previous year.

#### All schools

- In 2008/09, 88,270 appeals were lodged, compared to 86,020 in 2007/08.
- 63,720 appeals were heard by a panel, compared with 61,950 in the previous year, this represented 4.3 per cent of all new admissions to maintained primary and secondary schools in 2008/09, compared with 4.2 per cent in the previous year.
- 19,060 appeals were decided in favour of the parents compared with 19,150 in the previous year; this represented 29.9 per cent of appeals heard by a panel in 2008/09, compared with 30.9 per cent in the previous year.

#### **TECHNICAL NOTES**

### Background

- Admission authorities (local authorities (LAs) for community and voluntary controlled schools and governing bodies for voluntary aided (VA) and foundation schools), are required under the 1998 School Standards and Framework Act to constitute an independent appeal panel to hear appeals by parents against the non-admission of their child to a school for which they have expressed a preference.
- 2. In a number of our publications, we have changed the coverage to now include City Technology Colleges (CTCs) and academies, due to growth in this area. However, data are not currently collected from academies on admission appeals and for this reason the coverage here remains as local authority maintained schools only, as in previous publications.
- 3. Information presented in this Statistical First Release (SFR) is derived from two sources: the Survey of Admission Appeals and the School Census. LAs provided appeal data for their Community and Voluntary Controlled schools via the Survey of Admission Appeals. Voluntary Aided (VA) and Foundation schools provided appeal data via the School Census. Figures relating to admissions are calculated from the School Census for all schools.
- 4. The data include some large variations at LA level in the numbers of new admissions when comparing 2008/09 with 2007/08. This can be as a result of changes in provision at the LA, e.g. new schools opening, amalgamations and closures, or new sixth forms. It should also be noted that some of the variability is a result of differing admission arrangements amongst authorities. For example, some LAs admit pupils in August rather than the more standard arrangements in September.
- 5. The total number of appeals lodged by parents against the non-admission of their children can be misleading. Some appeals are resolved before they reach a panel hearing (a place at an alternative school is accepted after an appeal has been lodged; the same parent can lodge appeals for more than one school but will not pursue them all). Figures for the total number of admission appeals lodged are given in this publication but the number of appeals heard by an appeals panel is deemed to be the more reliable and critical indicator.

# Changes to this SFR

- 6. In last year's SFR we made some improvements to the way in which admission numbers were calculated and announced that following user feedback, and further analysis of the data, future changes may be made to the next SFR. We have since carried out additional analysis, and a further change has been made to the way admission numbers are calculated. Essentially, all nursery class pupils are now excluded from the count of admissions.
- 7. Following is a version of Table 1 of the SFR that shows the results of calculating admissions using the previous methodology.

8. Apart from the nursery class change explained above, admissions continue to be based on start dates between 1 September and the January census date. Some pupils are admitted at other times of the year and these are not included in the admission numbers in this SFR. All admission numbers are based on pupils on roll at the time of the January School Census.

# **Data Coverage / Revisions**

9. - 10. Pupil numbers at national and regional levels have been rounded to the nearest 10. Pupil numbers less than 5 have been suppressed being replaced in the table by an 'x'. Where any number is shown as zero (0), the original figure was also zero. Where the numerator or denominator of any percentage calculated on pupil numbers is less than 5, this has been replaced by an 'x'.
