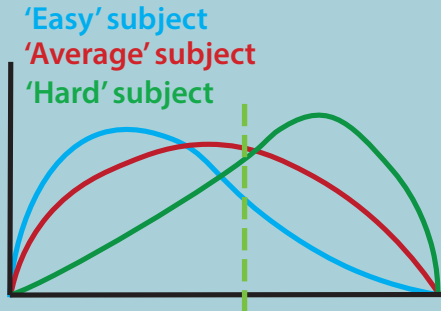


# Inter-subject comparability policy options

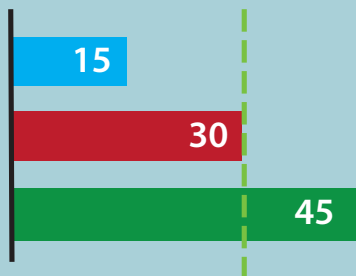
## Option 1

No action to achieve inter-subject comparability through the grade awarding process

% of students awarded A or A\*

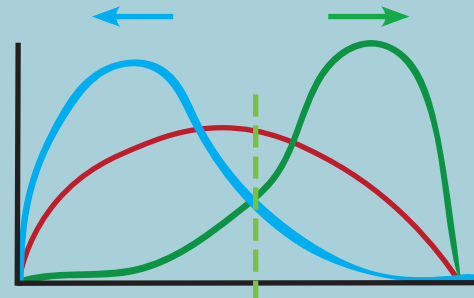


'Hard' subjects receive more As and A\*s than 'easy' subjects



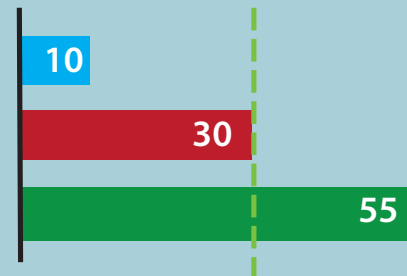
## Option 2

Action taken to achieve inter-subject comparability through the grade awarding process

% of students awarded A or A\*

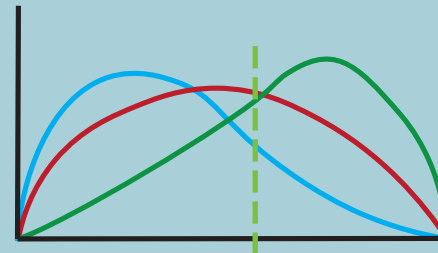


'Hard' subjects receive more As and A\*s than currently. 'Easy' subjects receive fewer than currently



## Option 3

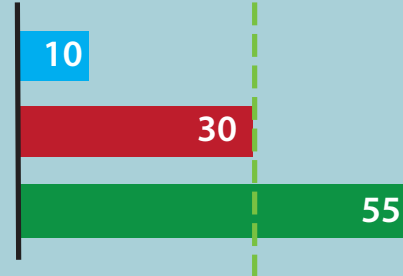
No action to achieve inter-subject comparability through the grade awarding process...

% of students awarded A or A\*

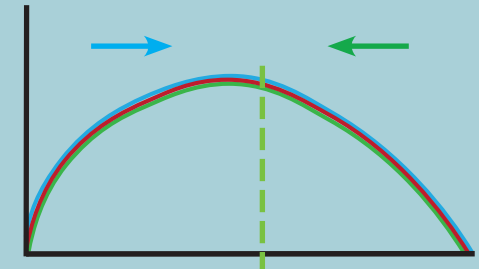


'Hard' subjects receive more As and A\*s than currently through award of alternative grade. 'Easy' subjects receive fewer than currently



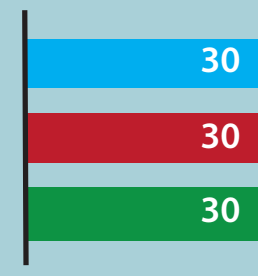
## Option 4

Action should be taken to achieve a plausible alternative to inter-subject comparability through the grade awarding process

All subjects whether 'hard', 'average' or 'easy' receive equal numbers of As and A\*s
