Thank you for your email requesting the following information:

The most recent figures on number of active members (i.e. that have trained this training year) of each Royal Artillery Army Reserve units (plus the Honourable Artillery Company), broken down by officers / other ranks (excluding those currently undergoing Phase 1 soldier / officer training).

The units I would like the data on are:

Honourable Artillery Company (Surveillance and Target Acquisition) (London) (Not part of the Royal Regiment of Artillery).[10]

101st (Northumbrian) Regiment Royal Artillery (STA & MLRS)

103rd (Lancashire Artillery Volunteers) Regiment Royal Artillery (Field Artillery) (Lancashire Artillery Volunteers Band)

104th Regiment Royal Artillery (Surveillance and Target Acquisition – Unmanned Air Vehicles)

105th Regiment Royal Artillery 'The Scottish & Ulster Gunners' (Field Artillery)

106th (Yeomanry) Regiment Royal Artillery (Air Defence Artillery)

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that the information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found attached. Please note: The figures have been produced by Defence Statistics (Army) using an improved methodology and are therefore not comparable to those figures used to answer your previous Freedom of Information requests. .


The term 'Active' has no definition in terms of statistical reporting. For the purposes of this request, the figures above include anyone who has received a payment for attendance at a training event in the Financial Year 2014/15, irrespective of whether they are still serving. A training event could be as short as a quarter day.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must

be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
