Please include antibiotics (antibacterials), anthelmintics, medicines and any other chemicals/medicines which the UK Government has data for.

GAAIA is seeking to access comparable data for Scotland.

However, data supplied by SEPA on 6 March 2014 (see Excel spreadsheet) appears to exclude full information on antibiotic use.

The attached SEPA data does include <u>Florocol</u> (Florfenicol) and <u>Panacur</u> (Fenbendazole) but may not include the full spectrum of chemical/medicine use on Scottish salmon farms.

Please therefore provide any annual chemical/medicine use data collected and collated by the VMD - or any annual chemical/medicine use data supplied by other Government agencies.

Please consider this a request for information under the relevant Freedom of Information and Environmental Information Regulations (as well as any other new or other regulations which may be appropriate).

Please provide this information electronically.

Thank you for your email dated 14 April 2014.


We are dealing with your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You asked for annual data on chemical/medicine use on salmon farms in Scotland since 2003, including antibiotics (antibacterials), anthelmintics, medicines and any other chemicals/medicines which the UK Government has data for.

Our Reply

Although we do not hold any data on medicines <u>use</u> on salmon farms, the National Surveillance Programme monitors the use of unauthorised and authorised products in UK produce which includes aquaculture. Details of surveillance results are published annually and can be found on the Veterinary Residues Committee (VRC) website at www.vmd.defra.gov.uk/vrc. Under section 21 of the FOIA we do not have to provide this information because it is accessible to you via a website. Section 21 recognises that the right of access is supplementary to the many ways in which public authorities already provide information to members of the public.

You may be also interested in data we hold detailing <u>sales</u> of antibiotics authorised for use in fish only, from 1993-2012 as set out below.



These figures provide information on the total annual quantity of antimicrobials sold that were authorised for use in fish for the period 1993-2012. Prior to this period the data on the sales of antimicrobials were not consistently collected nationally and therefore are not considered reliable. The data used to create this graph are included in the VMD annual sales data reports, and in the 1999 Advisory Committee on the Microbiological Safety of Food (ACMSF) report on 'Microbial Antibiotic Resistance in Relation to Food Safety', (http://acmsf.food.gov.uk/acmsfreps/acmsfreports).
