**FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: CLOUD STORAGE**

We refer to your email dated 28 April 2017, which was acknowledged on the 28 April 2017.

In your email you requested the following information:

**“Does your police for use cloud storage?**

**2. Do you use cloud storage for disclosure of evidence?**

**3. Do you use a third party / private company to store digital evidence, for example body-worn camera data e.g. Axon’s evidence.com

**4. Do you use a third party / private company for disclosure / sharing data e.g. with prosecution, defence and other individuals or authorities external to your police force. If yes please provide the name[s] of the provider.**

**5. Have you ever considered using a third party for collection, transfer, management, retrieval, sharing of data such as body worn camera video and audio.**

**6. If applicable please disclose your most recent policy and/or guidance on the use of cloud storage and using cloud storage for evidence.”**

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm some that information within the scope of your request is held.

In respect of questions 1-3, 5 and 6 no information is held.

In respect of question 4:-

**“4. Do you use a third party / private company for disclosure / sharing data e.g. with prosecution, defence and other individuals or authorities external to your police force. If yes please provide the name[s] of the provider.”**

The Ministry of Defence Police shares data with other Police Forces and Law Enforcement agencies using Home Office provided National Policing Applications, in accordance with Home Office Guidelines.

If you are not satisfied with this response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate the case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
