Thank you for your email of 19 May in which you requested the following information:

Please can you tell me which schools / colleges / other education providers for children aged 11 – 18 visited (a) AFC Harrogate, (b) ITC Catterick, (c) ATC Pirbright, (d) ATR Winchester, (e) ATR Grantham in each of the past three years, and how many visits each institution made.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held. The information you have requested is provided below.

Each establishment has provided information in response to your request based on the information they hold. This should therefore not be considered a definitive list but represents what is held on record. School visits have been interpreted as organised visits from schools, colleges and other education providers by pupils aged 11-18. This does not include visits of school staff or open day events for the general public.

- a) AFC Harrogate: No school visits however, Combined Cadet Forces who are attached to schools infrequently use the facilities.
- b) ITC Catterick: One visit by Trinity Catholic College, Middlesborough.
One visit by Kenton School, Newcastle.
- c) ATC Pirbright: No school visits.
- d) ATR Winchester: One visit by Sherburne School (Combined Cadet Force contingent of pupils)
- e) ATR Grantham: One visit by Aysgarth School.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
