Would it be possible to see how a breakdown of how JSA is calculated to be the amount that Claimants need to be able to live on.

DWP response

In response to your question, Income-related benefits such as Jobseeker's Allowance are paid at a rate set by Parliament each year. The amount is intended to cover all normal day to day living expenses. The amount of benefit payable depends on the individual circumstances of the claimant and their family, but the basic personal allowance for working age income related benefits in 2012/13 is:

- £71.00 for single person, 25 and over,
- £56.25 for those under 25
- £111.45 - couple, both 18 and over
