An Impact Assessment was carried out on the 15 primary schools within a radius of 0.9 mile of the permanent site for West London Free School Primary at Cambridge Grove based on local authority information that at least 80% of primary aged pupils travel up to a distance of one mile to school within the borough of Hammersmith and Fulham. The assessment concluded that the West London Free School Primary will not have a high impact on any school within this radius; a moderate impact on two and a minimal impact on thirteen. The assessment also concluded that where the potential impact is judged to be moderate, this is likely to be short term and that it is highly unlikely that the long term viability of any of the schools assessed will be greatly affected by the establishment of the West London Free School Primary.

Data for the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham shows that there is an 8.1% surplus of primary places as opposed to the local area's average of 1.9% and that the number of surplus places at reception is -7.3% with a predicted 18.1% increase in primary pupil population between 2011/12 and 2015/16. Although West London Free School Primary is for a two form of entry school, the Council believes that given the overall pressure on primary places in the surrounding areas, it is reasonable to expect that the school will be at full capacity. The West London Free School Primary is significantly oversubscribed for entry in 2013. The Council is fully supportive of West London Free School Primary – which forms a key part in its strategy to meet overall demand despite currently having a small surplus capacity within the surrounding primary schools of this proposed Free School. In addition the Council's ambition that all its schools should be judged outstanding by Ofsted may well be helped by both collaboration and competition between the local schools.

An S.10 consultation was carried out between November and December 2012.
