FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000. MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: VEHICLE FLEET INFORMATION.

Repairs/Maintenance; In order of TOTAL spend, Where they were hired from (which company (branch where applicable/available)) Top 10 will be sufficient in descending order

Vehicle Hires (external); In order of TOTAL spend, Where they were hired from (which company (branch where applicable/available)) Top 10 will be sufficient in descending order

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Any Technology providers you use for your fleet of vehicles (such as tracking, safety cameras) ; In order of TOTAL spend, Where they were purchased from (which company (branch where applicable/available)) Top 5 will be sufficient in descending order”

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP) and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

The total cost was £1,954,314.

The MDP has a contract with Inchcape plc. Inchcape arrange all servicing and maintenance. The spend on the contract during 1 January 2014 to 31 October 2015 was £1,482,184.

Repairs/Maintenance; In order of TOTAL spend, Where they were hired from (which company (branch where applicable/available)) Top 10 will be sufficient in descending order

The Ministry of Defence Police has a contract with Inchcape plc. Inchcape plc arrange all servicing and maintenance and repair. The spend on the contract during 1 January 2014 to 31 October 2015 was £1,482,184.

Vehicle Hires (external); In order of TOTAL spend, Where they were hired from (which company (branch where applicable/available)) Top 10 will be sufficient in descending order

The MDP hires vehicles through an MOD vehicle hire contract, that includes the main car hire companies in the United Kingdom. The spend on the contract during 1 January 2014 to 31 October 2015 was £1,468,033.

Any Technology providers you use for your fleet of vehicles (such as tracking, safety cameras) ; In order of TOTAL spend, Where they were purchased from (which company (branch where applicable/available)) Top 5 will be sufficient in descending order”

There was some minor spend in this area, e.g. satnav's, but the expenditure is not recorded separately.

If you are not satisfied with this response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, London SW1A 2HB (email CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate the case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
