

**I would be interested to view the statistics relating to passes verse failed tests amongst examiners at Farnborough DTC - is this information available?**

**Clarification received from requestor - They are happy to receive these statistics in an anonymised format, for the financial year 2010/11 for Farnborough DTC.**

The table below shows the pass and fail rates by anonymised examiners conducting car practical tests at Farnborough during the 2010/11 financial year. Please note that we have amalgamated the results of four examiners who have conducted less than eight tests; It is highly likely that these will be visiting examiners who are not permanently based at Farnborough. This information is correct as of 16 May 2011.
