Note:

Levels of maximum allowable effort by the UK fleet in each area with each gear type for the period 2014-15 are set out in Appendix 1 of Annex IIA of Council Regulation (EU) No 18119/13. However, the UK has applied for increases in these levels as allowed for within the regulation in recognition of the extra measures UK fishermen comply with to help reduce cod mortality. These increases will make a significant difference to the UK levels of effort, and as such to include the levels as they stand would be misleading. They are hence not included here. Once a response to the UK request has been received the revised effort levels will be included in these releases.
