Information held in the 2010/11 ARA is also available on our website at http://www.dft.gov.uk/publications/dsa-annual-report-accounts-2010-11

Therefore, information held in our ARAs on LGV and PCV tests for the period 2002/3 to 2010/11 is also exempt from release under section 21 (information accessible by other means) of the Freedom of Information Act.

Please note that in our 1989/90 ARA, the number of HGV/PSV tests conducted in 1988/9 is reported as 88,704 whereas in our 1988/9 ARA the number is quoted as 88,668. We do not hold information as to why there is a slight difference in the number of tests quoted as being conducted in 1988/9 in these two ARAs. It is likely, however, that the auditing of test

data resulted in the number of tests being conducted in 1988/9 being revised upwards slightly. We have, therefore, quoted the figure of 88,704 at Annex D.

The pass rates for 1988/9 that you find at Annex D were quoted as the same in both the 1988/9 and 1989/90 ARAs.
