We refer to your email dated 15 May 2016 which was acknowledged on 24 May 2016.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email of 15 May 2016 you requested the following information:

**“Please could you tell me what E-mail client your Force uses and the version number? For example Outlook 2007 or Lotus Notes v.6**

**Also, can you tell me whether or not your Force uses an programme/application to add the GPMS / GSC classification of the e-mail and if so what programme/application this is? For example Titus Security Classifier.”**

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The Ministry of Defence Police (MDP) currently uses Microsoft Outlook 2010 and Microsoft Outlook 2003. A program/application to add the GPMS/GSC classification of the email is not used.

If you are not satisfied with this response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate the case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
