## Background

This ad-hoc statistical notice presents further breakdowns of already published information on proven re-offending

Users should refer to the Proven Re-offending Statistics quarterly bulletin and accompanying Definitions and Measurements document for definitions of the terms used in this statistical notice, and for commentary to help interpret these results.

Table 1 in this statistical notice provides the number of proven re-offences, by type of offence, committed by offenders who were released from custody in 2010, and then re-offended in the following 12 months. A proven re-offence is defined as any offence committed in a 12 month follow-up period which received a court conviction, caution, reprimand or warning in either the 12 month follow-up or within a further six month waiting period (to allow time for cases to progress through the courts).
