Report on: Provider Appraisal Update

Introduction:

1. The Provider Appraisal directorate currently has four active assessments, with no decisions to be taken this month. There are two ongoing transaction reviews.

A. Update on assessments

2. A list of the NHS trusts currently with Monitor for assessment is provided in Annex 1. Any changes from the last report are highlighted in red.

Active assessments (exception reporting)

3. The directorate understands that the NHS Trust Development Authority (NHS TDA) will be considering whether to support the applications of Mersey Care NHS Trust and Central London Community NHS Trust at its November Board meeting.
4. The assessment of Sussex Community NHS Trust commenced 1 October 2015.

Assessment Pipeline

5. An overview of the assessment pipeline is provided in Annex 2.

B. Update on transactions and new models of care

6. Work on the review of the Royal Free London NHS Foundation Trust capital redevelopment of Barnet and Chase Farm commenced 1 October 2015, and is expected to be presented to Provider Appraisal Executive (PAE) for risk rating in December 2015.

7. Salford Royal NHS Foundation Trust (SRFT) is expected to submit an Outline Business Case for its Integrated Care Organisation (ICO) proposal around 1 December 2015. The ICO is one of the Public Account Committees vanguards and it is also noted that SRFT is involved in one of the Acute Care Collaboration vanguards. The ICO proposal involves all adult health and social care for the population of Salford being commissioned from SRFT who would then meet the terms of that contract through a combination of direct provision and sub-contracting from other providers.
8. This is the first new care model which has been passed to Provider Appraisal to review and dialogue to date with Provider Regulation and new models of care teams has suggested that the achievement of a 1 April 2016 transaction date may be ambitious.
9. A team is currently working on building an understanding of the transaction, including through a visit to Salford on 12 November 2015, with a view to adapting Monitor's transaction review approach to be as efficient as possible. An update on this approach will be brought to the PAE in December 2015.

Monitor's mission is to make the health sector work better for patients. This report provides an update on the Provider Appraisal team. The key focus of this team is to assess if providers are well led and can therefore deliver sustainable high quality services to patients.

It is not considered that there are any decisions within this paper which would impact on protected groups Identified by the Act.
