**Re-Determination of the Application by RWE
NPowerRenewables to construct and operate a
wind turbine generating station in Powys - Carnedd Wen**

I very strongly object to the above application.

Yet again the people of Powys are required to write and protest about the above application when we thought that it had been finally rejected last year following the extensive inquiry.

The proposed huge windfarm with turbines of such enormous proportions on the southern edge of Snowdonia National Park is a disgrace. The National Policy for Wales Paragraph 12.8.06 states that designated national and international areas should not be compromised. The windfarm and the grid upgrade will be so close it cannot do anything but compromise the National Park.

The beauty of our area, the tourist industry which provides an important income for this poor part of Britain, the wildlife and peat bogs will be severely adversely affected and for what? The 'pay back' time is years and even then on shore windfarms produce so little reliable energy. The only benefits are to the usually rich landowners and big businesses -in this case RWE.

The disruption of the infra structure will be enormous if the windfarm is erected. Roads will have to be altered and there will be major traffic disruption .

How is the power produced to be transferred to the Grid? Such a large windfarm as Carnedd Wen is going to require massive pylons which will further ruin the area.

The massive desecration of our lovely countryside by this huge industrial development should not take place.

This objection should be considered alongside the LLanbrynmair objection..
