Thank you for your email of 10 May 2017 requesting the following information:

“Please could I request an up to date list of all contractors, subcontractors and suppliers that have or will be involved with the building work at Defence Science Technology Lab - Porton Down”?

We are treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and we can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The prime Dstl contractor for current building work is Wilmot Dixon (telephone number 01462 671852) and Pick Everard (telephone number 0116 223 4400). In accordance with the conditions of Willmott Dixon’s contract with Dstl, the company can sub-contract and use suppliers as required; this is not information owned by Dstl.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance), we are aware that a state-of-the-art science park is being developed near leading scientific institutions, the Defence Science and Technology Laboratory (Dstl) and Public Health England (PHE) at the Porton Down site, near Salisbury – the Porton Science Park.
