Thank you for email of 28 March 2017 requesting statistics related to the number of crashes between junctions 24 (Potters Bar) and 25 (Enfield) of the M25. Your request has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI).

You have asked for information for the last two years between 28 March 2015 and 28 March 2017 in a monthly format.

I can confirm that we do hold the information. Under Section 21 of the Act, we are not required to provide information, which is already reasonably accessible to you. The information you requested is available via the two following website links
