RE: Inquest touching the death of Anthony Junior Daniel at Fulham Coroners' Court heard between the 14th day of May 2007 and the 25th Day of May 2007.

I am required under the terms of Rule 43 of The Coroners Rules 1984 and following the inquest touching the death of Anthony Junior Daniel at Fulham Coroners' Court heard between the 14th day of May 2007 and the 25th Day of May 2007 to report to you that the following action should be taken to prevent the recurrence of fatalities.

- A policy is to be developed to take account of the medical care necessary where a detained person is believed to have swallowed drugs and has identified additional high risk factors, such additional high risk factors are, as an example and not intended as an exhaustive list, the detained person is not eating and is not passing packages, the detained person is pregnant, the detained person is suffering with mental health issues.
- Steps are to be taken to provide an opportunity for a consultation with an independent medical practitioner with appropriate training following a decision to charge a detained person who is suspected to have swallowed packages of drugs. This consultation should be separate from the attendance of a forensic medical examiner necessary before a person is charged.
