# Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the "FOI Act")

I refer to your email of 11 May in which you requested information under the FOI Act from Monitor. I apologise for the delay in replying. As explained in our acknowledgement email of 10 June, a response has been delated due to a problem with our arrangements for receiving FOI emails.

Please note that, as we explained in our email, since 1 April 2016, Monitor and the NHS Trust Development Authority are operating as an integrated organisation known as NHS Improvement. FOI requests relating to NHS Improvement, including requests specific to Monitor or the Trust Development Authority, should now be sent to <a href="mailto:nhs.foi@nhs.net">nhs.foi@nhs.net</a>.

#### Your request

Your email includes a request for:

"- A piece of work done by Aldwych Partners on "evaluating the delivery of benefits from NHS mergers", which was commissioned last year."

This letter responds to that request. The response to your other request for another report will follow in a subsequent letter.

### **Decision**

NHS Improvement holds the information that you have requested, but has decided not to provide the report in response to your FOI request, as it is already in the public domain and reasonably accessible to you by other means (section 21 of FOIA).

## **Review rights**

If you remain dissatisfied, you may seek an internal review within NHS Improvement of the issue or the decision. A senior member of NHS Improvement's staff, who has not previously been involved with your request, will undertake that review.

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of any internal review, you may complain to the Information Commissioner for a decision on whether your request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the FOI Act.
