### Emerging Science and Bioethics Advisory Committee

#### ESBAC Stakeholders

##### Introduction

1. The Secretariat has started to identify and compile a draft list of potential stakeholders, grouped under broad headings. The list is attached for Members' consideration and comment, together with some background information on some of the stakeholders.
2. The purpose of the discussion is to start shaping what the Committee would find helpful in terms of stakeholder management, including stakeholder mapping (e.g. visual representation), understanding stakeholder relationships (identifying links and relationships) and identifying any early stakeholder engagement that the Committee thinks is required.
3. It is recognised that the stakeholder list needs to be dynamic, to ensure it is relevant to particular topics and specific areas of work at any point in time. The Committee may consider that some of the stakeholders listed are core, whilst others are secondary, peripheral, or indeed not a potential stakeholder.
4. For specific areas of work undertaken, a tailored stakeholder list can be compiled from the master list, with new stakeholders added as appropriate and the master list refreshed.
5. As part of this exercise, Members belonging to or with known connections to any of the organisations listed or membership of any other relevant committees have been flagged up. This is to start mapping ESBAC's presence in the wider stakeholder arena with a view to establishing links, including horizon scanning/networking opportunities.

##### Action

Members are invited to consider and comment on the draft stakeholder list (e.g. to identify potential gaps) and suggest what the Committee would find helpful in terms of stakeholder management information.

To assist the mapping exercise, Members are also invited to highlight any relevant committees or organisations that they have current or previous connections with, or identify any other relevant stakeholder connections.
