Release of Information

Thank you for your correspondence dated 11 August 2014 requesting information on Royal Marines applications, interviews and passing out for the years 2010/11 and 2011/12. Your enquiry has been considered to be a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

I can confirm that the Department holds the information you requested and taking your questions in turn:

- Q1. The total number of applicants received for employment as a Royal Marine during the years 2010/11 and 2011/12?
- A1. 2010/11 4350 applications, 2011/12 3300 applications.
- Q2. The number of these applicants which were invited for interview?
- A2. 2010/11 2050 interviewed, 2011/12 1650 interviewed.
- Q3. The number of those applicants who successfully completed training and "passed out".
- A3. 2010/11 700 passed out, 2011/12 510 passed out.

To clarify, these statistics exclude applications for commissioned officer and are rounded to the nearest 10 with numbers ending in 5 or more rounded up and 4 or less rounded down.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please

note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
