Summer Schools Funding:

Conditions of Grant 2014 to 2015

June 2014

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Introduction

1. Education Funding Agency (EFA) will pay the Summer schools grant for the 2014-2015 financial year under Section 14 of the Education Act 2002. The grant is for secondary schools to deliver extra support to year 7 pupils who did not achieve level 4 in the key stage 2 national curriculum tests in reading and/or mathematics. Academies that meet the criteria set out by the Secretary of State under Section 16 of the Education Act 2002 will receive their allocation in two instalments in June 2014 and October 2014.

Basis of allocations to academies

2. The Department has made a **provisional** allocation for each academy's summer schools funding. A schedule of schools taking part in the programme in each local authority is set out on the accompanying spreadsheet. The allocations are based on £250 per **eligible** pupil per week, identified by each participating secondary school that will run a summer school.

3. Summer schools funding allocations will be **adjusted in October 2014** when schools submit confirmation that the summer schools took place and confirm the number of eligible pupils who attended. A revised spreadsheet will be issued with the final breakdown of 2014 to 2015 summer schools funding, by eligible school.

Payment arrangements

4. Summer schools funding will be paid by the Secretary of State to the Academy in two instalments:

- June 2014 (50% of provisional allocation)
- October 2014 (remainder of final allocation)

Overpayments

5. Any overpayment made by the EFA to an academy will be recovered in October 2014 from the academy's General Annual Grant allocation.

Further information

6. The books and other documents and records relating to the recipient's accounts shall be open to inspection by the Secretary of State and by the Comptroller and Auditor General. The Comptroller and Auditor General may, pursuant to Section 6 of the National Audit Act 1983, carry out examinations into the economy, efficiency and effectiveness with which the recipient has used its resources in discharging its grant-aided activities.

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7. The academy shall provide such further information as may be required by the Secretary of State for the purpose of determining whether it has complied with the conditions set out in this document.

Other conditions

8. If the conditions of grant are not met by the academy it may be required to repay the whole or part of the grant, as determined by the Secretary of State. The amount will be notified in writing to the academy and will immediately become payable to the Secretary of State.



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
