

**Could you please supply the approved driving instructor part one, two and three pass rates for January to June 2012 inclusive?**

In the table below, you can find the pass rates for the ADI part one test for January to June 2012 inclusive.

<b>Month</b>	<b>ADI part one pass rates</b>
<b>January 2012</b>	51.36%
<b>February 2012</b>	51.29%
<b>March 2012</b>	51.08%
<b>April 2012</b>	50.46%
<b>May 2012</b>	48.55%
<b>June 2012</b>	49.80%

The ADI part two and three pass rates for April to June 2012 inclusive are due to be published on 30 August and you'll be able to find this information using the website addresses above.
