**Subject:** comments on representations for Llanybrymair and Carnedd Wen wind farms

Dear Sir/Madam,

I repeat my comments from the first round, as nothing has changed (ref Objector Comment 42). Indeed, nothing has changed from the original situation that led to the refusal of the planning consent by the Secretary of State.

Due to inefficiency of onshore wind, lack of economic sustainability without subsidy, lack of use of British engineering and manufacturing and the short lifetime of these installations with the resulting devastation, I call upon the Secretary of State to do the following:

- uphold the decision to refuse planning for BOTH these windfarms and the Mid-Wales connection. Permanent refusal of the latter will ensure that no further windfarms can be built in these remote and unconnected locations.
- ensure that no further appeals can be made, preventing further waste of public money by companies determined to get their subsidies.
- do NOT reopen the public enquiry. Refuse planning for good. Enough public money has been wasted on this.

I also refer you to the five months of convoys sent from abroad down the unsuitable link roads to mid-Wales. The resulting additional carbon emissions (from the convoys and the delayed traffic) and the road damage make further nonsense of the proposal.
