Thank you for your email dated 13 September 2015. You asked:

An MEL Glider Winch registration 87AY48 was recently disposed of by the MOD onto the open market. Would you please advise the sale price achieved by the disposal?

I am treating your letter as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The MOD regularly updates its equipment and those items which are declared surplus to requirement are sold through the MOD's Disposal Services Authority (DSA). DSA has a network of marketing contractors to ensure the best financial return is achieved for the disposal of publicly-funded items. Witham Specialist Vehicles is the specialist contractor for ex-MOD surplus vehicles. MEL Glider Winch Registration No. 87 AY 48 was sold by this company on 14 August 2015; the sale price was £9266.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
