Public Health England's reactive line about the delay in the publication of results for the Municipal Waste Incinerator study

Dr Simon Bouffler, Deputy Director of PHE's Centre for Radiation, Chemical and Environmental Hazards, said: "It was originally envisaged that preliminary results for this study would be available by March 2014 but because of the unanticipated complexity in gathering data this has been delayed. A paper with preliminary results is now expected to be prepared for submission to a peer-reviewed journal around the end of 2014, with publication in 2015.

"It is import to stress that Public Health England's position that well run and regulated modern Municipal Waste Incinerators (MWIs) are not a significant risk to public health remains valid, and the study is being carried out to extend the evidence base and to provide further information to the public on this subject."

Note:

PHE is funding the Small Area Health Statistics Unit, Imperial College London, and the Environmental Research Group, King's College London, both part of the MRC-PHE Centre for Environment and Health, to carry out the study.

Additional line which I am about to send as he asked for more detail:

Dr Simon Bouffler said: "Some of the data on emissions from MWIs were unexpectedly held in paper format rather than in electronic files, and had to be entered manually onto computer before the statistical analysis could begin. There was a delay while this process took place."
