Thanks for this. and I have chatted this through. To take your points in turn:

Arrival in Tokyo: The best way is to ask BA to escort the Mayor and PS from landing through to the domestic terminal. We've already contacted BA here to inform them the Mayor will be visiting and to say someone from your team will be in touch to request VIP help, but it would be good for the request to come from you - you may also want to use your contacts in the UK. Haneda is quite a small operation so it's very hard to get full facilitation. BA should be able to facilitate you in getting the bags etc eg. One can escort the Mayor through, and the other can assist the PS in getting checked baggage. In addition, we'll ask the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for exemption of giving Biometric data at Immigration. He will still have to line up (although with BA assistance should be off the plane first etc and whizzed along) but exemption from biometric data will mean immigration is done quickly. In order to request this, we need the attached form to be filled in and returned to us - we need to submit to MOFA at least a week before the visit.

Our local BA contact for VIP escorts etc is —she is extremely helpful.



Train tickets: We can bulk buy the tickets on your behalf but the best way to do this is probably if you have a corporate credit card we can get the details of? Invoicing and charging can get really complicated!

Travel times has run the times past our driver team and they say they are good estimates. They suggested that from the Embassy to Mitsubishi probably takes 30 mins (currently scheduled for 45 mins) but it's probably good to have a bit of leeway in the schedule for overrunning, as well as traffic. Tokyo traffic is by no means as bad as somewhere like to the itinerary looks very reasonable to them.

Translation company/vehicles: It would be best if you could liaise directly with the interpreters and vehicle hire company. The two companies introduced you to for the Deputy Mayor's visit are our preferred suppliers and totally reliable. The car hire company will also be able to give you a view on timings.

I hope this all makes sense. Let me know if you want to chat through further - Very happy to talk through.

Sorry for the long email, hope this answers all your questions, as we're now not having our conf call until tomorrow. I also have a couple of questions, below, regarding the BBC filming at Hankyu.

Firstly, you're right, we will have 5 media travelling with us and and I will be looking after them. They are:



We will be meeting up with the media on Sunday when we all arrive in Tokyo, then we will all be travelling together by train to Osaka on Monday morning – we don't yet have exact times for this, but expect to arrive in Osaka around lunchtime on Monday and we'll then check in at the Intercontinental.

& I are keen to walk through the Mayor's planned evening walkabout in Dotonbori when we arrive on Monday afternoon.

All of the Mayor's party who are arriving in advance, including our media, will be leaving our luggage in Tokyo and travelling to Osaka with small overnight bags, so we won't have a large amount of luggage. Obviously, the media will have their camera equipment with them. Only the Mayor and his private secretary, who arrive direct in Osaka on Monday evening, will have large suitcases.
