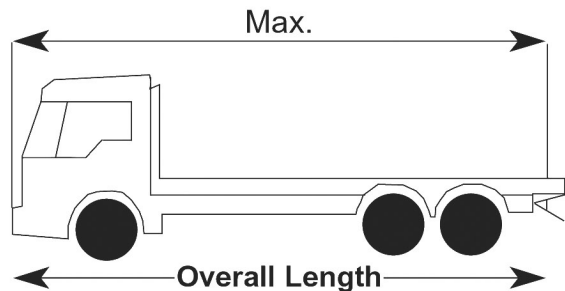
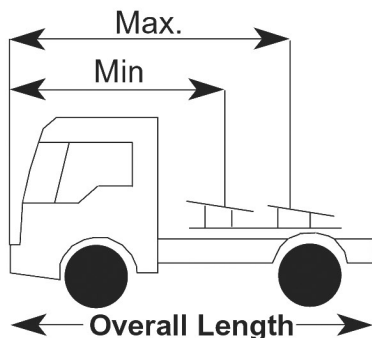

- For new motor vehicles please take this form to your Local Vehicle Office (LVO) along with the other documents needed to license the vehicle.
- If you have made any changes to the chassis, brakes or running gear (except any normal replacements) which have not been notified to VOSA in Swansea, you must fill in the form VTG10 and send it in with this application. You may need to pay a fee for the VTG10 examination.
- Make sure that the dimensions you give on this form are accurate. They will be checked from time to time at the Vehicle Testing Stations and you may be delayed if there are any mistakes. you may also be checked when travelling abroad, again any mistakes may cause delays.
- The overall length and width to be shown are as defined in Regulation 3 of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986. When measuring width disregard any projecting mirrors and lights. When measuring length disregard any projecting mirrors. **In the case of tractors and drawing vehicles it is only the length and width of the vehicle that should be given. Do not include the length and width of the trailer.**
- The maximum dimensions authorised by EEC directive 85/3 for vehicles used in international traffic are as follows:

* 'conditioned vehicle' means any vehicle whose fixed or movable superstructures are specially equipped for the carriage of goods at controlled temperatures and whose side wall, inclusive of insulation, are each at least 45mm thick.
