FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 REQUEST REF: 0374-15

Thank you for your email of 14 April 2015 asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

I am requesting a list of meeting that meet the following criteria:

meetings where any representative from private organisations were present - ie any nongovernment organisations or businesses

- AND where the stated purpose of the meeting was to discuss Lethal Autonomous Weapons Systems (LAWS)
- OR where the agenda for the meeting contains an item relating to Lethal Autonomous Weapons Systems (LAWS)
- OR where minutes from the meeting (if there are any) indicate that Lethal Autonomous Weapons Systems (LAWS) were discussed

For each of the meetings I would like to know

- the date
- location of the meeting
- persons present, and their organisations

I am not requesting the minutes of the meeting or any documents relating to the the meeting.

I am not requesting details of meetings where only government employees were present.

I am not requesting details of meetings where only government employees / representatives were meeting employees / representatives of foreign governments.

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request. Please find attached in Annex A below the information that the FCO can release to you.

Some of this information has been withheld under section 27 – international relations. Section 27 is a qualified exemption and is subject to a public interest test. This applies to two of the meetings listed in the information released. We acknowledge that releasing information on which other states attended those meetings would increase public knowledge about the international discussions on LAWS. However, s.27 (1) (a) recognises that the

effective conduct of international relations depends upon maintaining trust and confidence between governments. If the United Kingdom does not maintain this trust and confidence, its ability to protect and promote UK interests through international relations will be hampered, which will not be in the public interest. In this instance, the meetings in question were not public, and disclosing a list of which states attended could potentially damage the bilateral relationship between the UK and those states. However, a number of the other meetings listed were in public fora, and in those cases the details of which states attended has been provided. For these reasons we consider that the public interest in maintaining this exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing it.

Additionally, some of the information you have requested is personal data relating to third parties, the disclosure of which would contravene one of the data protection principles. In such circumstances sections 40(2) and (3) of the Freedom of Information Act apply. In this case, our view is that disclosure would breach the first data protection principle. This states that personal data should be processed fairly and lawfully. It is the fairness aspect of this principle, which, in our view, would be breached by disclosure. In such circumstances, s.40 confers an absolute exemption on disclosure. There is, therefore, no public interest test to apply.

Once an FOI request is answered, it is considered to be in the public domain. To promote transparency, we may now publish the response and any material released on <u>gov.uk</u> in the <u>FOI releases</u> section. All personal information in the letter will be removed before publishing.
