# Domain 2 – baseline figures for indicators 2, 2.1, 2.4 publication of 2011/12 data

- 1.1. Baseline figures for the following domain 2 indicators are published here pending methodological work associated with their standardisation<sup>1</sup>, at which point indicators will be included in the Health and Social Care Information Centre (HSCIC) Portal<sup>2</sup>:
- 2, Health related quality of life for people with long-term conditions
  - 2.1, Proportion of people with long-term conditions feeling supported to manage their condition
  - 2.4, Health related quality of life for carers

## Indicator 2 Health related quality of life for people with long-term conditions

- 1.2. Average health status score for individuals aged 18 and over reporting that they have a long-term condition, derived from responses to the EQ-5D survey instrument. The derived value takes a maximum score of 1 (full health).
- 1.3. For 2011/12 the estimated value is 0.73.

## Indicator 2.1 The proportion of people feeling supported to manage their long-term condition

- 1.4. For 2011/12 the estimated value is 69.6%

## Indicator 2.4, Health related quality of life for carers

- 1.5. Average health status score for individuals reporting that they are carers, derived from responses to the EQ-5D survey instrument. The derived value takes a maximum score 1 (full health).
- 1.6. For 2011/12 the estimated value is 0.81.
