- 1. In the years 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 what percentage of Cpls who were eligible for promotion were promoted to Sqt?
- 2. Of those who were promoted to Sgt how many had a permanent medical grading of P3 MLD, P3 MND, P7 (MLD or MND)?

Q1. In the years 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 what percentage of Cpls who were eligible for promotion were promoted to Sgt?

This information is held for the last two years only as follows:

2016 – 42.53%

2015 – 40.22%

Q2. Of those who were promoted to Sgt – how many had a permanent medical grading of P3 MLD, P3 MND, P7 (MLD or MND)?
