

Under the Freedom of Information Act, DSA recently released information on the numbers of ADI's as at 4th May 2011

THESE FIGURES SHOWED: Grade 6 = 2,834, Grade 5 = 15,768 Grade 4 = 24,529

This however does not show gradings for the remaining 3,940 ADIs, which has resulted in one organisation claiming that there are almost 4,000 ADI's who have been graded as a sub-standard Grade 2, or Grade 3, which from my experience I know not to be the case.

Can you supply me with the check tested numbers, who have been graded as 'E' educational, those who have still to be checked tested for the first time, and the remaining Grade 2 and 3s.

The table below shows the number of approved driving instructors (ADIs) who were on the register as of 4 May 2011 and 1 October 2011. These figures have been broken down by grades 6 through to 1, those graded as 'E' (educational) and those who have not been check tested to date.
