Biographical Details

Nick Williams was first appointed by the Prime Minister in March 2008. He has been Principal of The BRIT School, Croydon, since 2001. Mr Williams was previously Head Teacher at Thomas Tallis School, Greenwich, and has 35 years' experience in London state schools as a teacher of English and History. He was previously a registered Inspector for OFSTED and a Schools Inspector in Southwark during the 1990s. Mr Williams has been an Education Adviser for the Department for Education since 2009, is a Trustee of Nordoff Robbins Music Therapy and a founder Governor of the Birmingham Ormiston Academy and The Crescent Primary School.

- 1. Nick Williams is the Imperial War Museum's Education Trustee. He is also a member of the Museum's Regeneration: IWM London Committee which has oversight of its major redevelopment and First World War centenary projects.
