1) The total number of ADIs on the register of approved driving instructors [ car].

As of 9 January 2012, there were 46,612 approved driving instructors (ADIs) on the register.

2) The number of ADIs that are Fleet registered.

As of 10 January 2012, there were 2,443 Fleet ADIs on the register.

3) The number of ADIs that have been removed for sub standard check tests over the last five years on a yearly basis and at what stage they were removed; fist check test, second, etc.etc.

In the table below, you can find the number of ADIs that were removed from the register in the last five calendar years, after receiving three substandard check tests.

4) The number of potential driving instructors (PDIs) that are on their first pink badge.

According to our reports, as of 12 January 2012, 4,373 trainee licence holders have had one licence issued.

5) The number of PDIs that are on their second pink badge and the number of PDIs that are on their third or subsequent pink badge.

According to our reports, as of 12 January 2012 1,397 trainee licence holders have had two licences issued and 494 trainee licence holders have had three or more licences issued.

- 6) a) The number of PDIs that have passed part one of the qualifying exams.
- b) The number of PDIs that have passed part two of the qualifying exams.

As of 10 January 2012, our reports show that out of those who applied in the past two years and have not yet qualified; 2,430 PDIs have passed part one but not part two and 4,170 PDIs have passed part two.
