1) Please could you provide me with the number of drivers that passed the large goods vehicle (LGV) practical test for the 12 month period ending in September 2009?

Between 1 October 2008 and 30 September 2009, 25,565 candidates passed their LGV practical test.

2) Please could you provide me with the number of drivers that passed the LGV Driver Certificate of Professional Competence (CPC) module four test in the period from 10 September 2009 to August 2010?

Between 10 September 2009 and 31 August 2010, 3,318 candidates passed their LGV Driver CPC module four test.

3) Please could you provide me with the number of drivers that passed the LGV Driver CPC module four test from 1 September 2010 to 31 December 2010?

Between 1 September 2010 and 31 December 2010, 1,684 candidates passed their LGV Driver CPC module four test.
