- 1. Document aim. To raise awareness of the Gas Safe Technical Bulleting No.120 (TB120), concerning the use of corrugated stainless steel semi-rigid gas piping (CSST) in domestic and non-domestic installations.
- 2. Background. TB120 provides guidance as to the use of CSST in domestic and non-domestic installations. It also clarifies Gas Safe's position in relation to the use of CSST in unventilated ducts or voids and in protected shafts containing a stair and/or lift shaft, or other means of escape.
- 3. Action required. Any individual involved in the design, specification or installation of this type of gas pipe is to read, understand and comply with Gas Safe's TB120.
