# Stakeholder engagement on the Strategy for the Management of Solid Low Level Radioactive Waste from the Non-Nuclear Industry in the United Kingdom

We would like to invite your views on the proposed Strategy for the Management of Solid Low Level Radioactive Waste from the Non-Nuclear Industry in the United Kingdom (UK NNI LLW Strategy). The UK Government has worked in partnership with the Devolved Administrations to produce the draft strategy.

This draft strategy fulfils the first part of Government's commitment to produce a UK-wide strategy. It covers the majority of sectors making up the non-nuclear industry and will include general information applicable to the whole of the non-nuclear industry.

A second phase of consultation will focus on the specific needs of those organisations which produce wastes containing naturally occurring radioactive materials (NORM). This will be the focus of a second public consultation in 2011.

Following this we will consider your responses when finalising the first phase of the UK NNI LLW Strategy through the relevant Ministers.
