

1) The total [average] number of occasions Joint Approval Unit for Periodic Training (JAUPT) approved training centres/consortia failed to upload drivers' hours to the recording and evidencing (R&E) database within 10 working days for the period 1 April to 8 September 2010

Between 1 April and 8 September 2010, there were 12,087 cases where driver hours were uploaded to the system in excess of 10 days.

2) The total [average] number of courses uploaded to the R&E database within 10 working days for the period 1 April to 8 September by JAUPT approved training centres/consortia

Details of 133,000 driver's courses have been uploaded between 1 April and 8 September 2010. The report that gives this does not tell us the length of time between course delivery and course upload

3) The total [average] number of occasions JAUPT approved training centres/consortia failed to upload drivers' hours to the R&E database within five working days for the period 10 September 2010 and 31 January 2011

14,483 drivers were uploaded to the system in excess of five days between 10 September 2010 and 31 January 2011.

4) The total [average] number of courses uploaded to the R&E database within five working days for the period 10 September 2010 and 31 January 2011 by JAUPT approved training centres/consortia

Details of 150,043 driver's courses have been uploaded between 10 September 2010 and 31 January 2011. The report that gives this does not tell us the length of time between course delivery and course upload

5) The number of occasions the worst offending singularly JAUPT approved training centre/consortium failed to upload drivers' hours to the R&E database within 10 working days for the period 1 April 2010 to 8 September 2010

The worst offending centre uploaded courses in excess of 10 days of completion on 285 occasions.

6) The number of occasions the worst offending singularly JAUPT approved training centre/consortium failed to upload drivers' hours to the R&E database within 5 working days for the period 10 September 2010 and 31 January 2011

The worst offending centre uploaded courses in excess of five days of completion on 115 occasions.

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
