

In the 2011 calendar year:

a) how many category B tests were taken in cars with dual controls and what was the pass rate?

b) how many category B tests were taken in cars without dual controls and what was the pass rate?

In the table below, you can find the number of category B (car) practical tests conducted and passed in 2011 in vehicles that were and weren't fitted with dual controls. We've also provided you with the pass rate.
