

Please could you provide me with the number of approved driving instructors (ADI) on the register and the number of those that are yet to be graded, graded four, five and six?

You can find the number of current ADIs on the register, those that are graded four to six and those that are not yet graded in the table below. This information is correct as of 4 April 2011.

Current number of ADIs	47,008
Number of ADIs graded four	24,553
Number of ADIs graded five	15,680
Number of ADIs graded six	2,840
Number of ADIs not yet graded	3,471

Please note that:

- the remainder of current ADIs will be graded one to three
- those ADIs that are not yet graded are either awaiting a check test to be arranged, awaiting a further check test after receiving an educational grading after joining the ADI register or not due for a check test
