Ending Gang and Youth Violence: Funding Allocations

The Ending Gang and Youth Violence Report set out the Government's plans to reprioritise £10 million of Home Office investment in early intervention work in 2012-13 to support up to thirty areas "most affected by gangs and youth violence". Twenty nine areas were identified and are set out below.

The allocations are based on the size of each local authority area's population of 10 to 24 year olds.
