## **United Kingdom Anti-Doping (UKAD) – Chair Reappointment**

Hugh Robertson, Minister for Sport and Tourism has reappointed David Kenworthy as Chair of UKAD for a second term of 4 years. His term of appointment will run from 23 February 2013 to 22 February 2017.

### **David Kenworthy**

David Kenworthy is a retired Chief Constable. He started his career in the Metropolitan Police as a cadet in 1966 and served in that force until 1987 when he transferred to Surrey Police as a Superintendent. This was followed by service in Avon and Somerset Constabulary as Assistant and Deputy Chief Constable. In February 1998, David was appointed Chief Constable of North Yorkshire Police. He retired in November 2002.

Following retirement, David became chairman of the Community Foundation Network that represents the 57 community foundations in the UK. Community foundations raise money for local good causes. In 2007, David was elected chairman of the Institute of Advanced Motorists an organisation that runs the advanced driving test and trains company drivers and is the largest road safety charity in the UK.

David was appointed Deputy Lieutenant of North Yorkshire in 2004.
