BYE-LAWS

Made by the President of the Air Council in pursuance of the powers vested in him in that behalf by the Military Lands Act 1892 as applied by the Air Force (Application of Enactments) (No.1) Order 1918 for regulating the use of certain Air Force land in the Halton Command for the purposes to which it is appropriated and for prohibiting all intrusion on such land and all obstruction of the use thereof.

1. NO costermonger, hawker, pedlar, huckster, marine store or other dealer, or rag and bone and bottle gatherer or bookmaker or racing or betting tout, or vendor of newspapers or any kind of literature, or photographer or person engaged in any similar traffic or occupation to any of those specified, unless in possession of a Pass issued under the authority of the Air Officer Commanding, Royal Air Force, Halton shall intrude or enter, or be upon, the said Air Force land for the purpose of selling, buying or trafficking, or otherwise carrying on his or her or any like business or calling.
2. NO person shall enter or be upon the said Air Force land for the purpose of idling, loitering, or behaving in an indecent or disorderly manner, or for the purpose of gaming, betting or wagering, or of pursuing or killing game.

3. NO person shall enter or be upon the said Air Force land for the purpose of carrying or of applying for permission to carry the kits of airmen or other persons, or of obtaining any other kind of casual employment
4. NO person shall enter or be upon the said Air Force land for the purpose of removing Cartridge Cases, lead from the butts or any kind of metal or other material unless duly authorised and in possession of a Pass issued under the authority of the Air Officer Commanding Royal Air Force Halton
5. NO person whatever shall continue on the said Air Force land after being warned off by an Officer or by any other person acting under the authority of an Officer
6. NO person unless in possession of a Pass issued under the authority of the Air Officer Commanding Royal Air Force Halton shall camp or bivouac or sleep out upon the said Air Force land
7. NO person without the authority of an Officer shall deposit broken glass or other rubbish upon the said Air Force land
8. NO night walker or common prostitute shall locate herself in or trespass on or resort to the said Air Force land for the purpose of prostitution
9. NO person without the authority of the Air Officer Commanding Royal Air Force Halton shall cut grass or cut and remove turf or use the said Air Force land for the purpose of grazing any horse cow sheep or other animal
10. NO person without the authority of an Officer,

shall light a fire on the said Air Force land for any purpose whatever; nor shall any person by throwing down lighted or live matches or in any other way do anything causing or tending to cause a fire to break out on the said land

11. NO driver of a hackney carriage taxi-cab or other vehicle shall enter or be upon the said Air Force land for the purpose of plying for hire without a Pass issued under the authority of the Air Officer Commanding Royal Air Force Halton
12. NO person shall ride a horse Motor cycle or cycle upon any footpath by the side of any Air Force road wholly maintained by the Air Ministry and situate on the said Air Force land
13. NO person without the authority of an Officer, shall ride or drive a horse cycle motor car or any mechanically propelled vehicle over any road wholly maintained by the Air Ministry and situate on the said Air Force land
14. NO driver of any motor car motor cycle or other self propelled vehicle shall drive at a speed exceeding ten miles an hour on any road wholly maintained by the Air Ministry and situate on the said Air Force land on which notices regulating the speed of such vehicles have been posted
15. NO motor car motor cycle cycle or vehicle shall be driven over any road wholly maintained by the Air Ministry and situate on the said Air Force land without a light between the hours of one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise The provisions of this bye-law are in addition to and not in derogation of any existing statute local or other bye-laws or regulations which may now or

- (1) The Air Officer Commanding Royal Air Force Halton
  - (2) Any Officer Warrant Officer Non-Commissioned Officer or any Royal Air Force Service Police-man for the time being under the Command of the said Air Officer Commanding ;
  - (3) Any person authorised in writing under the hand of the said Air Officer Commanding ; or
  - (4) Any constable;

← shall have power and are hereby authorised :-

- (1) To remove from the said Air Force land and take into custody without Warrant and bring before a Court of Summary jurisdiction as provided by the Military Lands Act 1892 to be dealt with according to law any person contravening any of these Bye-laws
  - (2) To remove from the said Air Force land any vehicle animal or thing found therein in contravention of any of these Bye-laws and any such vehicle animal or thing shall be liable to forfeiture as mentioned in the aforesaid Act

17. ANY person doing anything prohibited or otherwise contravening any of the preceding Bye-laws Numbers 1 to 15 respectively shall be deemed to commit an offence against the same and is under the said Act liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Five Pounds

18. NOTHING in these Byelaws shall interfere with any public right of way but subject as aforesaid the

expressions "Air Force Land" or "land" shall include all roads and footpaths situate on such land

19. THE land to which these Bye-laws apply is specified in the Schedule hereto and a plan showing the boundaries of the said land can be inspected at the office of the Air Officer Commanding Royal Air Force Halton

20. COPIES of these Bye-laws can be obtained at the price of one shilling for each copy at the office of the Air Officer Commanding Royal Air Force Halton by any person who desires to obtain the same
