

1) The number of Driver Certificate of Professional Competence (CPC) training hours recorded in 2010

There were 2,522,451 hours of Driver CPC training taken in 2010. This information is based on that held on our recording and evidence system.

2) The total number of drivers anticipated to require a Driver CPC card

The business case for Driver CPC estimated that 590,000 LGV drivers and 166,000 PCV drivers were anticipated to require a Driver CPC card. It should be noted that this is an estimated number as no one, including industry trade associations, has been able to provide a definitive figure or a better estimate of the driver population.

3) The number of Driver CPC training hours recorded in 2011 to date

There has been 1,365,503 hours of Driver CPC training taken between 1 January and 17 May 2011. This information is based on that held on our recording and evidence system.
