NATIONAL INTEGRATED OFFENDER MANAGEMENT (IOM) CONFERENCE: CHANGE IN DATES - 3 AND 4 JULY 2012

On behalf of the IOM National Strategic Board, I am writing to alert you to changes in the dates for the third national IOM conference. We have had to revise the dates for the conference in order to secure the range of speakers that will set the overall context for the event. I am sorry for any inconvenience that this change may cause, particularly if you have already expressed your interest in attending the conference on the previous dates in June. I am afraid this does mean that we must ask all colleagues to re-submit a new booking form, just to be certain about availability on the revised dates.

The conference will be held at the National Policing Improvement Agency (NPIA) Headquarters in Ryton-on-Dunsmore, near Coventry on 3 and 4 July 2012. The event will be free to attend. It will run over two days and with a keynote address by the Minister of State for Policing and Criminal Justice, Nick Herbert MP.

Key themes that will be addressed during the conference include expanding the partnership base for IOM within the context of a changing landscape, which includes significant policing, criminal justice and health reforms. Full details of the conference programme, including a range of interactive briefing sessions, will follow shortly.
